Welcome

to Western Australia

The powerhouse of the Australian economy.

Western Australia's economy is export-oriented, with around half of Australia's exports of goods originating from the state each year, including minerals, petroleum, agri-food and specialised manufactured goods. WA also attracts many international visitors and students.

These export industries support employment across the WA economy resulting in one of the best opportunities for students to live and work part time. Thanks to WA's mining industry, the state boasts the biggest takehome pay packet of the nation.

Perth, the capital of Western Australia, sits where the Swan River meets the southwest coast. It is the largest city in Western Australia and the fourth most populous city in Australia and Oceania.

There are many exciting career and job opportunities available to international students studying in Western Australia. WA is classified as a regional destination; as an international student, you may be eligible for post-study work rights.

International students can register at Study Perth's Careers Centre employability portal to access their Careers Connect support. This service assists students in developing their career pathway, connecting with employment opportunities or securing a part-time job while studying.

Jobs Connect forums are also run regularly by the Department of Jobs, Tourism, Science and Innovation to connect West Australian employers with international students to help find them the best job for their skillset.

The day-to-day living costs in Perth for international students are lower than other major cities in Australia (and worldwide), making it an affordable destination and attractive place to live.



Study on Campus

Experience university life right from the start with all classes held at Murdoch University's Perth campus. Murdoch College students are part of the university community from day one and have access to a range of facilities and services.

While on campus, you will connect with University students to gain a better understanding of what studying in Australia is really like.

Direct Entry Pathways

It's never been easier to get into the degree you want. Murdoch College offers you a pathway into a range of Murdoch University degree programs. Graduate from our Foundation Studies program, or Murdoch University Preparation Course and move straight into the first year of your chosen degree, or complete a Diploma and start in the second year of a bachelor's degree. For students who have completed higher levels of study, our Postgraduate Qualifying Program offers a pathway into a range of master's degrees.

Preparation Oriented Learning

At Murdoch College we take a complete approach to university preparation. We don't just consider what you're learning, we also help you develop the skills you need to be successful in your studies.

You will experience a university-style course structure with tutorials in the Foundation Studies and Murdoch University Preparation Courses, and workshops for Diplomas and the Postgraduate Qualifying Program. Just like university students, you'll be assessed through exams, coursework, assignments and group tasks. You will develop study techniques over the duration of your time at Murdoch College, so by the time you're at university, you will have the skills to be proactive and independent in your study.



Train

Just 15 minutes from the city to Murdoch train station, then either a quick trip by connecting bus or a 10 minute walk to the campus.

Mandurah campus

Set in the heart of a coastal town, our Mandurah campus offers clinical, academic and research expertise and state-of-the-art facilities. Getting here is easy as we're accessible by car, public transport and bicycle. You'll find us on Education Drive in Greenfields, Mandurah, next to South Metropolitan TAFE and close to the Kwinana Freeway.

Rockingham campus

Our Rockingham campus focuses on our enabling pathway programs. We're located on Dixon Road in Rockingham, a major urban centre on the south coast of the Perth metro area, so we're easily accessible by car and public transport.



Accommodation

There are a range of accommodation options available for students when they come to study with us at Murdoch College, from on campus at Murdoch University Village, to independent rental or Australian Homestay. There's something for everyone.

On-campus Student Village

Enjoy the complete student experience by living on campus at Murdoch University. With easy access to classes and university facilities you'll have the opportunity to make friends in a fun environment where you will be encouraged to live, learn and grow. The Village also has direct access to public transport and a range of local shops, so nothing is ever too far away.

Shared or privately rented accommodation

If you want to live off-campus you have the option of renting a single room in a house or apartment that is occupied by several other people, or you can take on an entire lease for a single property yourself. In a share house you will have your own room, but amenities such as kitchens and bathrooms will generally be shared with your housemates. Shared accommodation is a great option if you don't want to live by yourself and you want to make friends with both local and international students.

Homestay

Homestay is a great option if you are looking to experience Australian culture and adapt to living and learning within a secure environment. You will be placed with a local host family who will welcome you into their home. Here you will benefit from a supportive family environment where English is the primary language spoken, allowing you to practice everyday conversation.

If you are under 18 you need to follow specific requirements about where you can live and who you can live with before you can get a student visa.

Why study Foundation Studies with us?

Foundation Studies prepares you for successful transition to degree-level study, providing a pathway to the first year of study of a bachelor degree at Murdoch University. This program has been specifically designed for international students.

Pathway to any degree

This course is suited to you if:

- · you need an entrance qualification for Murdoch University
- you want to accelerate your university preparation after Year 11, or equivalent
- you want to change your degree stream after Year 11, or equivalent

On successful completion* of your Foundation Studies program, you'll gain entry to the first year of most undergraduate degrees at Murdoch University, with the exception of Veterinary Science and Education. Veterinary Science can be accessed through the Bachelor of Agricultural Science (Animal Science) (0102135).

*Higher requirements and specific subject scores are required for Law and Engineering (Honours).

Structure and Pathway

In the Foundations Studies program you will complete eight units over two study periods, studying a combination of core and elective units. The units you undertake will be determined by your chosen degree. Each unit of study builds concepts from an introductory level through to university entrance level. The units are designed to develop your learning techniques as well as bridging gaps in your academic knowledge.



Why Study a Murdoch University Preparation Course?

Our Murdoch University Preparation Course (MUPC) is very similar to the Foundation Studies Program however it has 2 variations — a standard course delivered over 3 trimesters and made up of 9 units and an accelerated version made up of 4 units and delivered over 1 trimester.

MUPC students study the same units as Foundation Studies students with a reduced study load to support their progression. The academic entry requirements, fees and articulation requirements for the MUPC course are the same as those for a Foundation Studies course.

The standard variation of our MUPC is a 9-unit course which is delivered over 3 trimesters and gives students the time they need to develop the necessary skills to succeed in their university studies.

The program is suited to you if:

- · you don't have the high school results for you to gain entry to your chosen bachelor degree
- · you want to change your degree stream
- you need to increase your chances of entering highly competitive courses at Murdoch University

Why Study the MUPC (Accelerated Entry)

MUPC (Accelerated Entry) has been designed for students who narrowly missed the direct entry requirements for the degree program of their choice. The MUPC (Accelerated Entry) provides students with the opportunity to improve their academic knowledge, and English language skills to enter university via a course which is appropriate to their previous level of study.




Your future career



Campus Map


